

AN ADVENT VIGIL BY PETER HAAS

Together, let us keep an Advent vigil—alone in our homes, or with loved ones; in a church sanctuary, or Theosis Chapel. On a plane, or office, or in the woods — wherever you may be at dusk during the month of December, keep vigil. Around the Vesper hour, let us each aim to take rest and be still and notice in the silence, at least for a few minutes, the fading light of the day as it moves from sunset, to twilight, to darkness.

The darkness of December is a sacred time; don't miss it amidst all the electrified lights. Humanity has for millennia, at least in the northern hemisphere, noticed the diminishing light of December and marked its nadir with various ceremonies on or near the Winter Solstice of December 21st. The lighting of bonfires, and now the lighting of our homes with gobs of wired colored lights or blow-up Santa's, was (and is) a way to ward off the night-time fear that the light of the Sun might not return. The fear that the sun might keep descending into the southern horizon - and never rise again.

This is one reason the Feast of Christmas that commemorates the

birth (nativity) of Christ, was chosen to occur on December 25th. It is the first day in the northern hemisphere that the sun appears to "move" back north, following a seeming three day pause of stillness on the horizon. Some call that superstitious; others call it mythic region. Informed by the esoteric side of the Work, we call it a principle: as it is above, so below. In other words, the heavens are declaring the Glory of God (Psalm 19), and history embodied that glory in the human person of Jesus, made radiant Son by the Logos/Spirit through Mary.

While all that is significant background information, what I am most interested in for our community this Advent season is our ongoing evolution into and as the Light of Christ. It is for this reason that I invite you to keep Vigil, watching and waiting with the fading light of each December day. Why? In part, this requires a certain stillness and silence to partake in fully; and, the silence and stillness of watching the fading light can serve and support our ongoing consenting to be vessels of the Light of Christ.

Keeping vigil with eyes open, also can become a type of visual lectio divina, or even a transformation of the sacred word of Centering Prayer into a sacred glance or image. When you notice you are engaged with your thoughts, just watch the fading light. Return ever so gently to the fading light. That is all that is required. Simply be with the light, and let the light be with you. Notice its slow transition, and shift of colors from bright blue to the oranges and reds of sunset, to the deep purple and violet of twilight, and then the indigo of night. Take the journey of light to night, and perhaps let It take you.

Like Lent, Advent is a season of preparation. Slowing down daily, during the dusk hour is a way of preparing to celebrate the historical birth of Christ in the world. It is also a way of preparing ourselves to become the continuation of the Light of Christ in the world. Of deepening our consent to be transformed into Christ – and to let the Light of Christ heal and integrate every pixel of darkness hidden in our unconscious, afraid

to let go and be called by name into a new life.

At year's end, we mark the "completion" of another sacred journey around the sun. We have been well nourished by Its Energies and Influences. By God's Grace, and our conscious Work, we have, little by little, evolved more as Christ. Such a journey is worthy of pondering and reflecting upon. Give yourself the gift of keeping a monthlong vigil at the dusk hour. If not for the month, at least keep a vigil for the Christmas week.

May our vigil crown this year of evolution with the Light of Christ.



I Once Was Lost

Early in my life I was expected to be many things including perfect, well-behaved, and emotionally tough. I spent the majority of my life trying to meet these expectations with the assumption that doing so would make me successful and gain the approval of others. Little did I know, however, was this self-created picture of myself-or rather, an idea of who I should be-was nearly impossible to live up to. And yet, thanks to my stubbornness, I continued to strive to meet these impossible standards despite the inevitable consequences. Eventually, I got tired of trying to emulate this ideal image I created of myself. Overtime it became difficult to not make any mistakes; to avoid social faux pas; and to mask the expression of my true underlying feelings.

I soon began to struggle with intense feelings of personal failure and disappointment. Deep down I felt like an imposter; I was playing a role and playing it very well. So well, in fact, that I lost all sense of who I really was; no longer recognizing my own true feelings and desires. What made matters worse was that I was too afraid to ask for help because it would make me appear less than adequate. I

reached a point where I didn't feel like I had anywhere else to turn. I felt completely and utterly lost.

God Found Me

Growing up my understanding of God was fairly limited. It remained that way for the majority of my adult life. This limited understanding was likely attributed to feelings of rejection. I recall going to church with my friends and witnessing how strong their relationships were with God. They were clearly enraptured and moved by the Spirit. I, however, was not and it wasn't clear to me why. I remember doing everything that my friends were doing: attending church on Sundays, going to Bible study groups, praying and asking God to answer my prayers and open my heart. I wished to feel the way that they were feeling. I wanted to feel God's Love as strongly as they were; yet, all I felt was empty. I eventually doubted that God really loved me and felt neglected. I internalized the situation to mean that there was something wrong with me. This belief was skewed to a point that I judged myself to be unworthy. The pain from this realization was unbearable; hurt led to anger and anger led to action. Slowly, I began to focus my attention away from God.

Pursuing higher education became a priority in my life; the means by which I would avoid rejection and achieve approval. I eventually buried my head in the books and told myself that I didn't need anyone; that I can do this on my own. A wall was built to shut others out; it served as the perfect defense mechanism to avoid getting too close. My relationships with other people were surface level. It was easier to be there for others, but harder to expect them to be there for me.

It wasn't until I was introduced to the Church of Conscious Harmony when my heart began to open and I could feel again. I was immediately drawn to how genuine and accepting everyone was. They welcomed me (faults and all) and expressed their sincere love. I felt safe and comfortable; somehow, I knew that my heart would be taken care of. My guard fell down and I was willing to be vulnerable. In the loving embrace of my friends, I was given permission to be weak; to let go; to surrender. I was home.

With my heart open wide, I was able to experience my first spiritual awakening. Around the time when my husband and I were considering having children, I often wondered what it would be like to be a mother. One particular evening, I was

reminiscing about my mother and how much she loves me; knowing that she would do anything in the world to comfort me and make me happy. Like my mother, I knew that I would feel and do the same for my child. I was deep in thought about this when this scripture suddenly came to mind, For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. (John 3:16)

I paused for a long moment. Stunned, in fact, because it was nearly impossible for me to fathom the indescribable pain of losing a child. Just the thought of this brought me to my knees in anguish. After many long seconds passed, I began to question whether God loved me enough to sacrifice his one and only Son. Impossible. There is no way that this could be true. In the midst of disbelief, everything stilled. Then what seemed to come out of nowhere was this transcendent feeling of peace and joy that pervaded every cell in my body from the top of my head to the tip of my toes. While consumed with this feeling, I slowly looked up and repeated, not with question but with conviction, "God loves me so much that he sacrificed his one and only Son." I was completely overwhelmed; the breath knocked out of me. In this moment God revealed to me a love so great; a love much greater than the love one would have for their own child. Time slowed to a stop. This is when God found me.

It was this experience that solidified my commitment to making God the center of my life. Since having had this experience, I've become devoted to the spiritual journey and only wish to live God's Will for me; to return the Love that has been given. Love one another as I have loved you. (John 15:12)

My Spiritual Journey

While on the spiritual journey, I have realized that God has always been with me and never abandoned me. It is the Lord who goes before you. He will be with you; he will not leave you or forsake you. Do not fear or be dismayed. (Deuteronomy 31:8) God is holding my hand and my heart through this process. It is also clear that God is within me. When I was lost, I was looking in all directions outside of myself to find happiness. But now that I'm found, I'm looking in new directions. This scripture from Luke helps me remember: The kingdom of God is not coming in ways that can be observed, nor will they say, 'Look, here it is!' or 'There!' for behold, the kingdom of God is in the midst of you. (Luke 17: 20-21)

In committing to a daily practice of Centering Prayer and the Work of Inner Christianity, I am experiencing Silence and deepening the understanding of my inner life. As such, there is an uncovering of the unconscious conditioning to reveal the heart of Christ. When observing the feeling of fear or anxiety while talking in front of a group of people or sharing information about my personal life, Work principles are applied to separate from my false-self. The Work teaches that all thoughts, attitudes, and beliefs are not my own, but borrowed from somewhere else ready-made; that I am no-thing.

With this knowledge comes a deeper understanding around the conditioned beliefs that it's okay or not okay to behave the way I'm behaving, or feel the way I am feeling. Consequently, by labeling the reactions: "this is called feeling insecure," and "this is 'it' doing what it does," it's easier to non-identify and affirm that this is not my "self." This provides the space to give up my desire for approval and to remember that I am a child of God: that I am loved; that I am love. And so are you! Through this process of self-observation, non-identification, and self-remembering, this falseself is unraveling, allowing more and more growth into Christ.

Evolving as Christ

Through Christ, I am rediscovering my relationship with God. Fr. Thomas Keating explains our intimacy with God as Abba by stating, "God's relationship to us is characterized by immense and continuous concern. care and tenderness, and by an all-inclusive forgiveness that extends to everything in our lives, from the moment of conception until our death." As Christ, I am understanding God's Love, which extends outwards (in all directions) and sees beyond all differences. We are all part of each other. There is no separation. We are One. There is only One.

May we all be enraptured by God and moved by the Spirit within and beyond:

"Come Holy Spirit Come. Come and set our hearts ablaze with your love, light, and life, that we may more fully and selflessly love you and your creation. For the praise and glory of your name, for the evolution of Christ in these beings, on this earth, and in the cosmos, and so our joy may be complete. Amen." (2017 CCH prayer card)

LIVING THE WORK OF INNER CHRISTIANITY IN DAILY LIFE

THE SUN'S ROLE IN OUR INNER EVOLUTION INTO LIGHT

Work Idea: The Sun's role in the Ray of Creation, feeding planet earth and humankind with an energy that makes all cellular development possible. Also, the Sun is a symbol and source for the further possibility of conscious development on planet earth, beyond just physical evolution.

Work Source: Rodney Collin's extraordinary book, The Theory of Celestial Influence provides an expanded teaching on the Ray of Creation, and especially the role of the sun's role in our inner evolution into light. The following selection is taken from page 88, after Collin's detailed development of the nature of the sun and its creation of light for planet earth and human being in Chapters Four and Five: "The energy incorporated into physical bodies, when the latter die, becomes light again. If we remember the conclusion we just came to about the nature of light, we can even say that, physical bodies disintegrating, their matter returns to the divine state. Only the proof of this thesis is hampered by the fact that normally we can only conceive of consciousness attached to physical bodies, or to matter in cellular state. And it could only be established satisfactorily by the actual carrying over of consciousness into matter in electronic state. The whole question may then be put like this: Is this matter in its return to the divine state accompanied by individual consciousness? Who possesses an individual consciousness sufficiently permanent and sufficiently intense to take advantage of this infinite expansion of its vehicle? About such possibilities little is ordinarily known."

Practical Application: Therefore, Revelation is necessary. In particular, the Revelation of this possibility in and through Christ, Light of the World, Son of God, the

firstborn among many brothers and sisters (Romans 8.29). During this Advent and Christmas season, let's seek to interpret the ancient stories of Jesus' birth deeper than just a special child born for the "salvation of all people." Ask Spirit to take you deeper into the well-loved and well-known carols and scriptures. Christ and Christmas are more than just spiritual sentimentality. Christ is the Way it can go for each of us. Thus, keep daily vigil at dusk to experientially feel into how you too are evolving as Christ in the stillness, silence and dimming light of December.
