



WHAT CAN WE SAY OF GOD?

• St. Gregory (4th c.):

We cannot rightly speak of God at all.

• Author of *The Cloud of Unknowing* (4th c.): Thought cannot comprehend God.

• Pseudo Dionysius (6th c.):

All those who want to make statements about God are wrong, for they fail to say anything about him. Those who want to say nothing about him are right, for no word can express God.

WHAT CAN WE SAY OF GOD?

• St. John of the Cross (16th c.):

There are many attributes of God that we know nothing about – we have no concept or experience of.

• Bede Griffiths (20th c.):

All concepts of God are utterly ludicrous.

Merton (20th c.):
 All concepts about God are 'raids on the unutterable'
 (the unspeakable, the unreachable)

Wayne Teasdale (20th c.):
 We can't even reflect on the other attributes of God.




WISDOM






2000 years ago, stars were...


• 1995: Hubble deep field image

Standard Model of Big Bang cosmology






A BRIEF HISTORY






