What is Grace

In the New Testament, grace is translated from a term meaning 'divine favor,' 'goodwill,' 'that which gives joy,' and 'that which is a free gift.' Grace is the undeserved gift of God.

What is Mercy

Etymologically mercy means a heart for the affliction of another.

Or, as we understand it in English, it means compassion or pity.

Fr. Flader – Catholic Weekly

St Thomas Aquinas - "To say that a person is merciful is like saying that he is sorrowful at heart, that is, he is afflicted with sorrow by the misery of another as though it were his own. Hence it follows that he endeavours to dispel the misery of the other person as if it were his own; and this is the effect of mercy."

Mercy fuels compassion, providing promising glints of light in a darkened world. It is kindness, forward forgiveness, and empathy. Mercy chooses not to be offended, and compassionately sees a hurting heart behind hurtful words... Mercy is an extension of and expression of love, an act of kindness, compassion, or favor. Mercy is a characteristic of the one true God. M. Bucher

For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though He was rich, yet for your sake He became poor, so that you through His poverty might become rich. 2 Corinthians 13:14

Only the man who has had to face despair is really convinced that he needs mercy. Those who do not want mercy never seek it. It is better to find God on the threshold of despair than to risk our lives in a complacency that has never felt the need of forgiveness. A life that is without problems may literally be more hopeless than one that always verges on despair. T. Merton

To desire God to be merciful to us is to acknowledge God as God. To seek God's pity when we deserve no pity is to ask God to be just with a justice so holy that it knows no evil and shows mercy to everyone who does not fly from God in despair. T. Merton

The very contradictions in my life are in some ways signs of God's mercy to me. T. Merton

The man who is not afraid to admit everything that he sees to be wrong with himself, and yet recognizes that he may be the object of God's love precisely because of his shortcomings, can begin to be sincere. His sincerity is based on confidence, not in his own illusions about himself, but in the endless, unfailing mercy of God. T. Merton


