As we begin our new community aim, let us wish to begin this new octave in an abiding sense of wonder. Born from our accumulative work with "Holy Unknowing," may we, like Mary, ponder in our hearts what will manifest in 2025, knowing the power of bringing in the Holy.

In the Work of Inner Christianity, the reconciling force is also referred to as third force, neutralizing force or relating force. It is related to the motive, or the cause of why you are doing something. Beginning with a wish, an ascending octave yields to what is higher than itself.

Maurice Nicoll describes third force as that which lies between the opposites, and has the function of gradually uniting, so that ultimately we have no great opposites but are in between them, where active and passive are replaced by Third Force. *Either-or* transforms to *Yes and No.* In Christianity, we may say... Christ is born.

A New Reconciling Force

Science was primarily built up on the concept of two forces: action

and reaction. I want *x*, you want *y*, I push my agenda, you push yours, and the reconciling force of life keeps us identified and righteous. We fight or leave or descend into resignation, losing force in identification and negativity – the treadmill of life.

Unless an individual thinks in a new way, they cannot enter the kingdom of heaven. I have been using this wisdom saying recently. It offers a flood of relief replacing the resistance with a sense of peace. I ponder, what is my higher purpose? What do You want of me? A deep inner-knowing responds, "I am as you created me to be, and I am where you want me to be. Relax...body still, mind quiet, heart open. That's what I want of you!" I enter into the silence consenting and waiting.... "Here I am, let it be done to me according to your word."

Relating to J.G. Bennett's wisdom, "If we have a very great wish to be used, then we can set ourselves to get out of the way to learn how to be empty. For this one must neither wish for anything for oneself nor must one even wish to give anything to others. To give something to others means that we are separate from them." *The Sevenfold Work*, p. 87

Despite and even because of the struggle, I understand that "through the regular practice of Contemplative Prayer, faith keeps growing. The sense of the divine presence becomes a kind of second nature or fourth dimension to the time/space continuum. It also manifests itself in everyone else and in every creature. God in us relating to God in everyone else." Thomas Keating, *Manifesting God*, p. 54

Reverencing a Self-Creating Sacred World

Jacob Needleman says, "What we and our Mother Earth need, and what has been needed since Man first appeared, is the energy of awakened and awakening men and women."

Nature is one of my greatest sources of help. She is a vehicle of Wisdom that grounds and opens me in gratitude. She awakens something deeper than emotional reaction to a deep energetic connection with the whole. At our three-day Advent retreat at Cedarbrake, we were invited to let go of thinking and to rest in gratitude. I accepted with "thoughts" as a trigger to remember myself and my aim and by using sensation in the exploration of "Thy will be done." In order to be a vehicle of higher will, I must slow down. This body, mind and spirit must come into harmony. I must sense and be willing to feel the opposites. Conscience feels all together.

I was so grateful to nap and rest

– on the ground above the babbling brook, on the cliffs further above the river and behind my room in a bed of greenery on my yoga mat. It was grounding. I felt held and vibrantly alive as I rested, listening to the trees letting go – leaves softly whirling in the wind, descending to the ground. Hearing the natural world is to hear the divine.

After the retreat, I sat outside and wrote. A little bee visited. My attention deepened as it landed on my hand. Then, it danced on my phone where I was reading an article from Gurdjieff's Early Talks. Next, it moved to my glasses first on the frame and then on the lens looking eye-to-eye at me. Amazing! I watched and sensed it was offering a message and read what it kept drawing my eye to in the article. It struck me as an instruction for how to manifest as "Holy Reconciling" in today's climate of polarity. The article said, "There is a law that after a push there is a pause. We can use this pause if we can prolong it and not rush forward to the next push. If we can be quiet, then we can take advantage of the vibrations, which follow a push. Everyone can stop, for there is a law that everything moves only so long as momentum lasts. Then it stops. Either he or I can stop it. Everything happens in this way." I will further ponder and work to use the pause.

Like J.G. Bennett says, "We

A School of Love by Tim Cook

There is a deeper us, a deeper spirit than any thought or feeling could ever get to and it is only by parting the curtain of our thoughts and deepening into the silent spiritual presence that we find ourselves and are transformed by that silence. And then we realize this silence is what we've been hungry for the whole time. We need to support each other in satisfying that hunger. Our community provides support in a world that does not prize daily silent practice, a world that doesn't know there is a new identity to be transformed into. A community like ours is an island of sanity, a statement of love that, in our own small way and in our own time, changes the world in ways we can't even imagine. Our community matters to the world because, like a monastery, it is a school of love.

The monks' charism is to be just barely in the world and praying for all of humanity. They know that the human family is one family and they realize that they are that organ of humanity that prays for the whole of the human race, on behalf of everyone. Our community's charism is to be "in the world, but not of it;" to be a little deeper in the world than the monks, yet to live like them in a monastery but without visible walls. Ours are walls of shared community intention that embrace our entire day, holding us in place and aiming our lives.

We intend to live as God's people, even though the world we live in doesn't prize or even acknowledge in any more than a superficial way that there is God. When we live in this way, knowing God in ourselves and ourselves in God, then we will have discovered the meaning of human life and we will have also given our gift to the world.

THE JOURNEY SCHOOL

The Journey School is a school of transformative spiritual psychology and practice of The Church of Conscious Harmony. It aims to be a spiritual resource for anyone, anywhere, who wishes to more deeply recognize, receive and respond to God as the center of their lives and participate consciously in the transformational spiritual journey into Christ. As such, The Journey School provides the community, structure, teaching, practices and support for the spiritual journey deeper into God's love and our fullness of Being. The Journey School offerings consist of:

An annual, yearlong curriculum consisting of a weekly email that includes art, Scripture,
teachings from the Work of Inner Christianity integrated with contemplative Christianity,
practices, links to a glossary, and archived emails and classes. Participants in The Journey School
are expected to read, reflect and engage the contents, suggested practices and exercises of the
weekly email.
A weekly online Thursday evening class that explores the ideas and practices of the Work of
Inner Christianity integrated with wisdom from the contemplative Christian tradition – a Zoom
gathering of sharing and discovery in a community of high intention and purpose.
Weekly Journey Groups, the primary place for the processing of our Work on the spiritual
journey and the nurturing of spiritual community in a small group setting. Discussion is shaped
by the weekly curriculum content and how participants are engaging with it in their daily lives.
Work Partners, one-on-one Work relationships supporting one another, setting daily aims, and
holding one another accountable.
Gurdjieff Movements, exercises and sacred dances having as their aim equilibrium and unity of
being, balancing the three centers, working in all three lines of the Work.

OBLATES

An Oblate of The Church of Conscious Harmony consents to journey deeper into Christ, what theologians call *Theosis*, what Jesus called "abiding with him," and what St. Paul called "union with Christ" or "putting on the mind of Christ." Participation as an Oblate is a declaration of intentional relationship to the Divine Mystery that is God and to all creation.

To become an Oblate, a vow is taken, renewable each January. The vow is born of a personal hunger and commitment for transformation into Christ and a wish to live a committed life in service of this aim. In making their vow, Oblates commit themselves to God and to living the Oblate *Rule of Life* so to actively participate in the spiritual journey while engaging the transformative process as "monks in the world." Oblates also fully participate in The Journey School programs by receiving the weekly email, attending the Thursday class, and participating in a Journey Group (with the option of having a Work Partner and participating in the Gurdjieff Movements). One's vow is to God alone yet lived out through and with the Church community.

In addition, the Oblate *Rule of Life* consists of the following commitments:

- 1. Twice daily Centering Prayer practice
- 2. Daily reading of Scripture

- 3. Daily study and application of the ideas of the Work of Inner Christianity
- 4. Daily conscious movement (e.g., tai chi, yoga, walking)
- 5. Weekly immersion in a Eucharistic devotional service
- 6. Sacred service for the Church community, such as Sunday Seva, Youth Educational Services (YES), the daily Centering Prayer service team, audio/visual team, Communion Committee, Floral Committee, et al.
- 7. Commitment to attend a multi-day Centering Prayer retreat annually
- 8. Attendance at the annual weekend Oblate retreat
- 9. Meeting with the Abbess at least annually
- 10. Tithing

CIRCLE OF DEVOTION OBLATE

A Circle of Devotion Oblate of CCH consents to journey ever deeper into Christ, what theologians call *Theosis*, or simply, Love. Participation is a declaration of intentional relationship to the Divine Mystery that is God and to all creation. A Circle of Devotion Oblate is ordinarily a community elder who has been practicing silent contemplative prayer for many years and wishes to move deeper into the interior stillness and simplicity of silence and prayer, perhaps in expanded solitude. They commit oneself totally to God and to living a personalized expression of the Oblate *Rule of Life*, tailored by the Holy Spirit and supportive to their life state and stage. Their work is prayer: prayer for the community, with an ethic of accompaniment; keeping vigil for the world, in solidarity with the suffering; abiding in peace, surrendered to God, freely giving and receiving love. The intention of a Circle of Devotion Oblate is to affirm that the spiritual journey leads many to a deep interior stillness, where all of life becomes prayer and prayer becomes life in self-emptying love for all and everything. They participate and bless the community through their Being and prayer. Commitments may be discerned in conversation with the Abbess.

Always in All Ways

So you wish to begin a new life?

Then begin here and now with whatever you are doing, however dark and meaningless it may seem. For your work is to find God, always and in all ways – at all times, in all places, in any company, and in all ways. This is the wayless way that leads us to grow in everything and increase unceasingly, without end.

Contemplative Prayer

AT THE THRESHOLD OF ALL IN ALL BY MEREDITH BERMAN

Our January aim "Reverencing a Self-creating, Sacred World" is punctuated with Cynthia Bourgeault's explanation of the fourth dimension from her book Thomas Keating: The Making of a Modern Christian Mystic: "Everything in this world – every quark, atom, dust speck, heartbeat - quivers with the presence of God and is the presence of God. That is the 'fourth dimension' Thomas was speaking of, 'The presence of God should become a kind of fourth dimension to all of life.' ... The fourth dimension kicks in when one suddenly grasps the whole thing as alive and vibrantly 'one,' a single living sacrament reemerging in every nanosecond from the ever engendering wellspring of God."

I will not forget receiving the meaning of this (or at least a level of it). It was a time bending moment where ordinary time broke open for a download and regathered itself after fleeting, yet eternal seconds.

On an ordinary day walking around my home, I passed through

the archway of my library - a threshold as I now understand it - and my body suddenly stopped. In the next moment, I received what felt like brain surgery to my consciousness. I saw the world in front of me and the world inside of me merging into one river similar to the clown trick of the never-ending pouch turning in and out of itself, revealing a new color at each turn. Flowers, grass, animals, computers, canvas, clay, coffee, gasoline, sister, brother, stranger, dirt, apple, dust, book, Jesus, Christ, me, you, all animated by the same roaring tide of light.

Everything in everything else. All in All.

This "surgery" was the receiving end of prayer. Over the course of two decades, I had been contemplating the question of heavenly exclusionism from my old tradition – how could heaven be granted to some and not others if we are all made from God? Without knowing what to call it, I was seeking an awareness of

All in All. I had sat in the silence and in contemplation; I had read; I had attempted several angles of understanding. Then one day it was as if God said, "Good research – pass under the threshold to find what you're looking for."

Each time it appears, I remember that third force – holy reconciling – often comes as a surprise.

We make effort at a four-dimensional reality until we can see one because as P.D. Ouspensky says, "The greatest lie is that we are three dimensional beings." Then, on one unsuspecting day, the boon of the harvest arrives. It is the shift from one end of the octave to the other, happening in an instant yet often backed by an entire timeline of effort.

And behind it all, supporting the trusses of our awakenings, is the causality of Centering Prayer – that *choosing* silence during a sit is practice for being *made* silent later. What a slow, tender, and unfolding grace God gives us as we awaken.

THE WORK OF INNER CHRISTIANITY

THE LAW OF THREE FORCES OF CREATION BY SANDRA ELY

Maurice Nicoll writes in The Commentaries, "we live in firstly a created and secondly an ordered Universe. If the Universe were chaos, there would be no order and no laws. Cosmos literally means order as distinct from chaos. If the world were chaos, the study of the laws of matter and so on would be impossible. Science could not exist. The *Law of Three* is the Law of the Three Forces of Creation. This law states that three forces must enter into every manifestation. But creation is governed by another law - the Law of Seven or the Law of Order of Manifestation. Creative forces could not work unless they created in some order and this order of manifestation or order of creation is due to the Law of Seven."

The Law of Three is responsible for *all* manifestations. The three components are: 1) active force, 2) passive force (or resistance), and 3) neutralizing (or reconciling) force. All three forces must come together

to create an event. Nothing has ever manifested without these three forces! First force can be considered what we want. Second force is what gets in the way of us acquiring it. And unless we are conscious, *life* is third force instead of the Work of Inner Christianity. The objective is to make the Work your third force.

To illustrate, let's say:

I want something (first force). Consider this a fill-in-the-blank exercise, e.g. someone's time, a quiet moment, a physical item, a positive outcome or result, quality service, to be right or in relationship, etc. Prior to getting that something, an obstacle or diversion arises (second force). Frustration, impatience or fear responds. With life as third force, nothing new is created and we end up in recurrence.

However, when the Work enters: I observe the negative emotion that is taking over. This scene isn't new. 'Observing I' has seen this film before. These situations are

mechanical and rooted in fears. This is just another 'I' and not who I really am. How delightful to be reminded again and have an opportunity to interrupt this recurrence for a new manifestation to occur (the Work as third force). With appreciation for this shift, I rebound and await the next right action – feeling a bit more energy and spaciousness in and all around me, cells, body, earth, cosmos.

We can learn to recognize first and second force in everyday situations. What's the initial action and the opposing reaction? To anticipate second force, one must observe first force. With frequent practice, we strengthen our Work accumulators. To keep this simple, ask yourself, "What do I want?" Then, observe what prevents you from acquiring it. Next, apply a Work idea – thereby encouraging the Work to be third force!



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



PRACTICING ATTENTION/INTENTION

Do what you are doing – the one thing needed – on purpose. The practice of attention/intention, as suggested by Thomas Keating, emerges from the dispositions of listening, consent and surrender found in Centering Prayer and Lectio Divina. Eventually, the practice transforms into the ardent desire to know the moment-to-moment presence of the Divine Indwelling through prayerful attentiveness in the ordinariness of everyday. When our lives are so ordered, all else is given. Our lives are being transformed into Christ.

Attention is the "how." Do what you're doing. Bring your attention to the present moment in its immediate content and keep it there – in the presence of God. Feel yourself in the activity.

Intention is the "why." Do what you're doing for the love of God, e.g. "I intend to eat this meal to be a vessel for God, aware of God's abiding Presence."
