A Recapitulation of the Iord's Frayer

"This is the only place in the Lord's Prayer in which a direct, outright gift is asked for...for this gift means finally "participation in eternal life"








IMPRESSIONS AND FIRST BEING FOOD: UNCONSCIOUS INFLUENCES

A SERIES OF IMPRESSIONS Through a long GI Tract Mechanical: Do not require Conscious attention








IMPRESSIONS AND FIRST BEING FOOD






THE WELCOMING PRAYER

"In connection with inner development we must understand by the term wilderness, a state of mind, a general inner state, comparable with a literal wilderness




and does not know which direction to go and must not go in his own direction...'



All the things in the world to which this day will bring increase; all those that will diminish; all those too that will die:

all of them, Lord, I try to gather into my arms, so as to hold them out to you in offering.

This is the material of my sacrifice; the only material you desire.

This bread, our toil, is of itself, I know, but an immense fragmentation;
