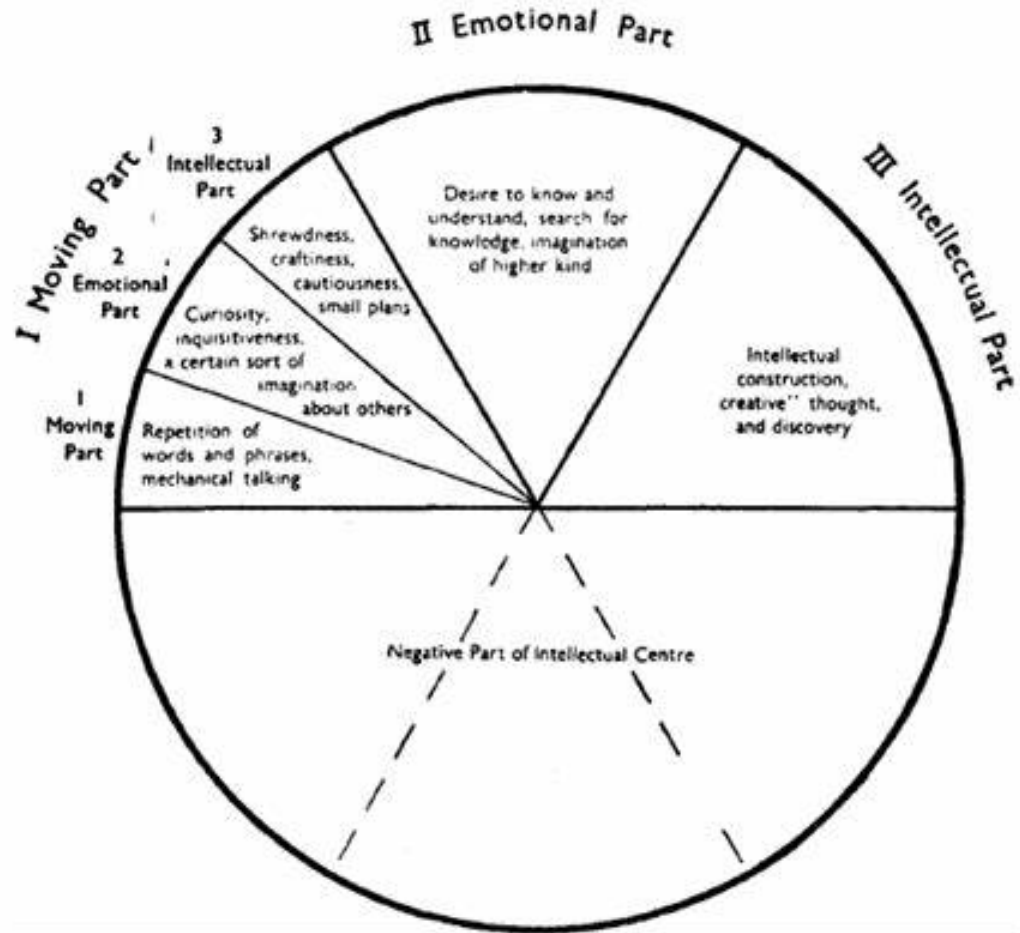
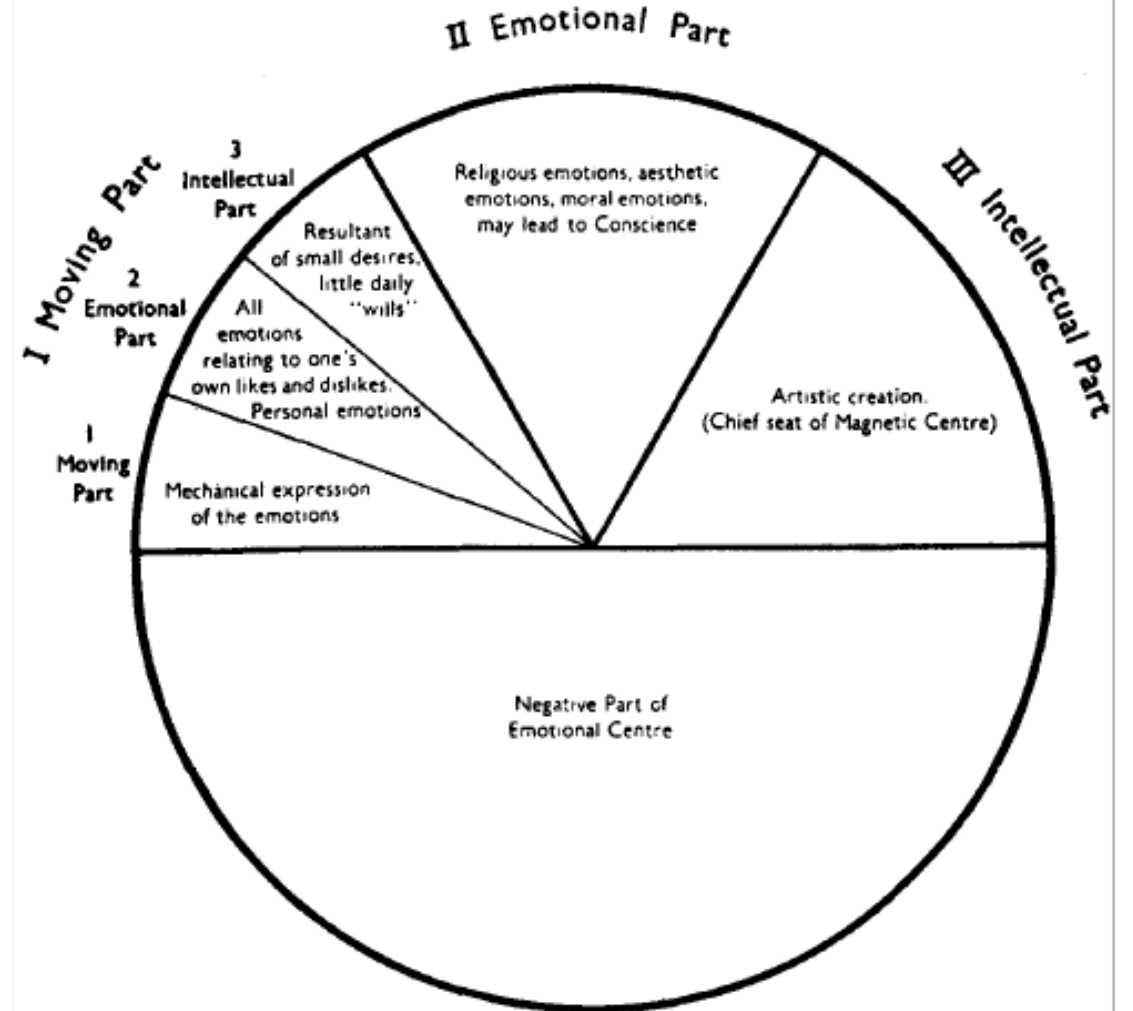


Figure II — Emotional Centre

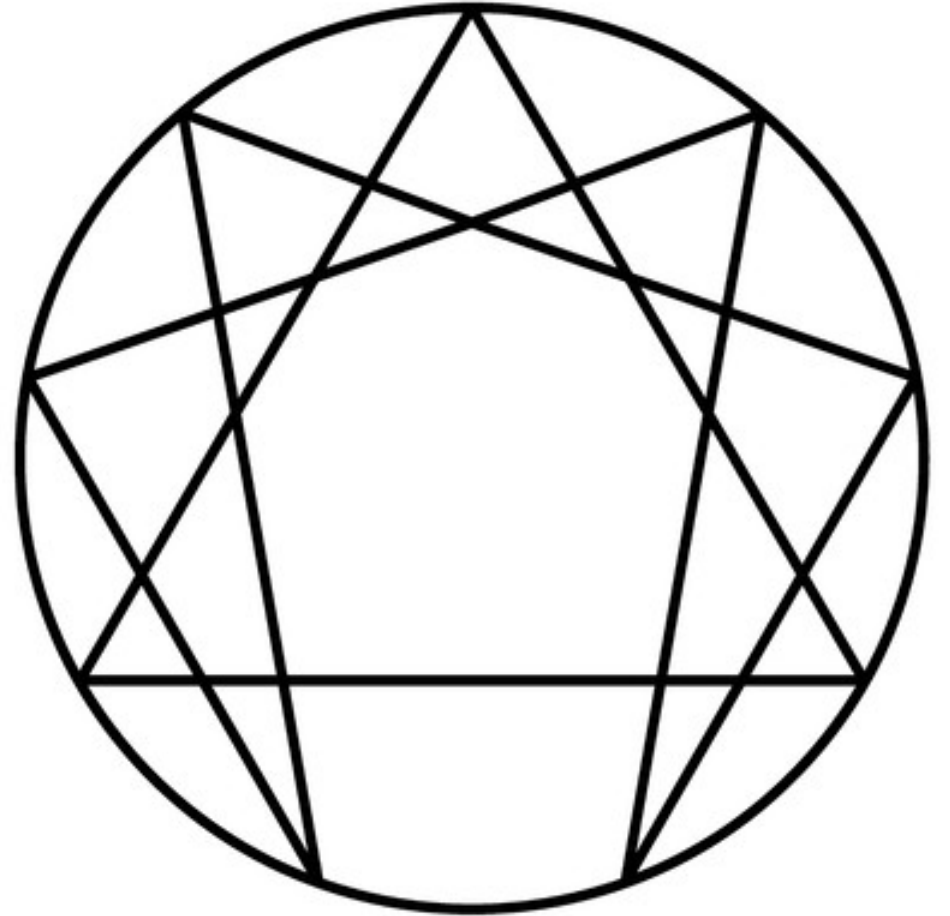
